Happy Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month!

Today kicks off the 13th Annual Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month (CALM)! We're excited about the great initiatives that all of our provincial members will be putting into classrooms across the country this month. A new storybook, All The Farmers You Will Know, is being introduced to younger students this year. Written by WS Marketing, the book highlights the wonders of the modern farm and the farmers and families who work and live on them.

Throughout March, we are also encouraging youth to discover career possibilities in agriculture and agri-food by promoting and encouraging students to use the video tool at <u>I Am The Future</u>. The tool generates a list of potential career options based on their personal attributes and invites youth to learn more about those roles at www.thinkAG.ca.

Both organizations provided official endorsements for AITC-C at the CFA's Annual General Meeting in Ottawa on February 28. Christa Wright and Mathieu Rouleau attended multiple events at the AGM, including a session on Growing Canada's Farm Financial Health and a panel on supply chain dynamics in Canadian agriculture, and networked with the wide variety of industry members in attendance. Christa presented to over 200 delegates on the work of AITC-C and the importance of agriculture education, which was met with resounding applause.

MANITOBA

CALM to Bring Watershed Learning in Manitoba

This March, AITC-M's Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month (CALM) program is set to visit 345 classrooms across the province, reaching over 7,300 students in Grades 2-4 with a visit from a producer or agriculture professional, an agriculture book, and a hands-on activity.

The 2024 edition includes a new resource, Caring For Our Watersheds. In this resource, students will explore watersheds — what they are, which one students belong to, how they function and why caring for our watersheds is important. Students will discover what farmers do to keep the water clean and ensure the sustainability of our watersheds and then propose ways they, too, can care for their watershed. The new resource was created with assistance from an AITC-M partner who recently came on board, the Manitoba Association of Watersheds. For remote classrooms or those without available volunteers for in-person visits, virtual sessions are arranged, ensuring widespread access. This year, CALM in Manitoba will be going as far north as The Pas, with in-person visits stretching over 500 kilometres north of Winnipeg.
